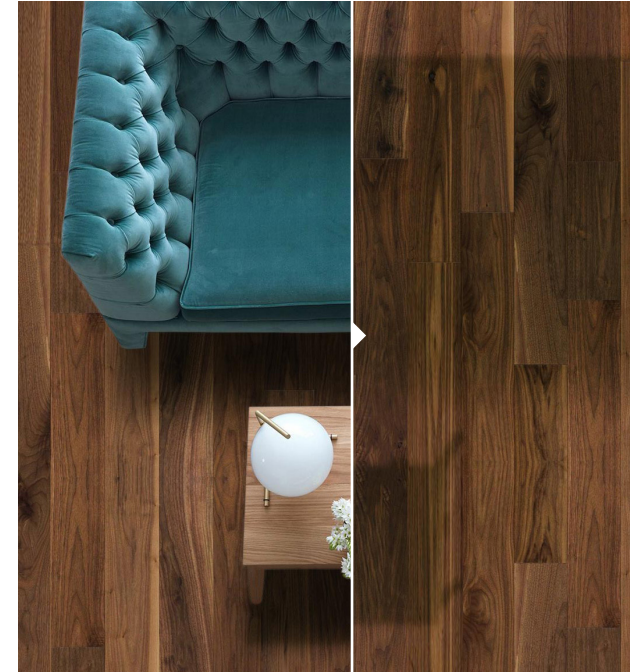

Light Sensitive Species



Photosensitivity is a wood's natural reaction when exposed to light. Many species of wood (like Brazilian Cherry, Teak, and even Oak to a degree) change color, lighten, or patina when placed in the sun. The affect is most noticeable when an object; like a couch, table or a rug, casts a sharp shadow onto the floor.

When you move the furniture, a ghost of the shadow may be left behind. But don't worry, your floors aren't damaged and it isn't permanent. The color will fade to match the rest of the floor in just a few days.

Walnut is particularly photosensitive. And because Walnut is so dark to begin with, the change can be much more dramatic.

If you are considering Walnut, it's important to be aware this species of wood is prone to color/shade changes after exposure to sunlight, and may differ greatly from flooring new from the box.
